The annual Lipton Challenge Cup is the top 1-design keelboat ocean racing event in the country and is a race rich in tradition and history, being started by Sir Thomas Lipton in 1911.

2015 is the first time KYC has entered an all-Junior team in this prestigious event - skipper Seth Young (at

16 the youngest Skipper of the fleet & his 4th Lipton Cup) with Jason Cook, Justin Stoker, Sara Young, Sage Pretorius and Georgou Divaris. Our helmsmen Georgou – the youngest in the fleet

at 15 - is a RS Tera World Champion and African Junior Laser Champion. Together they formed a super team with great team spirit, having sailed with the keelboaters at the Knysna Club every Saturday over the last few years. With an average of 16.4 yrs old they were the youngest team ever to have taken part in Lipton and looks good for the future of keelboat racing in Knysna.
